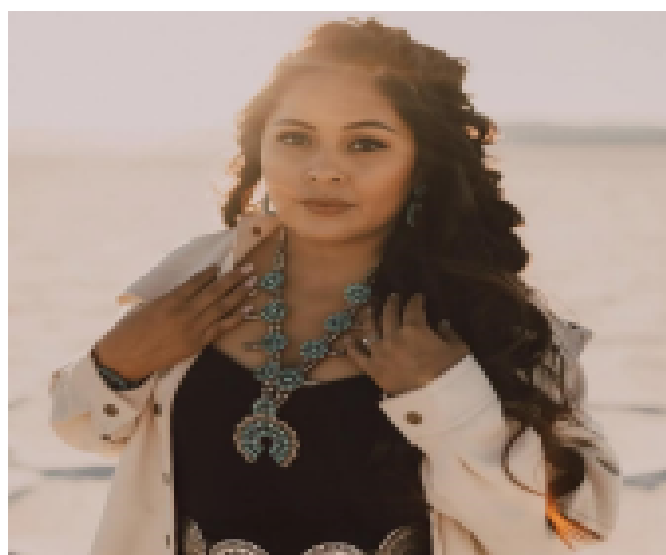

Keynote Speaker

Mickaela Allison-Aliifua

Mickaela Allison-Aliifua is a Dine (Navajo) Woman born and raised in Mapleton, Utah. Mickaela is born from the Bitter Water Clan (Todichiinii) and born for the Salt People Clan (Ashihi). She graduated from Maple Mountain High School in 2013. While attending High School she swam competitively for the MMHS Swim Team. At the age of 6 she regularly attended Nebo Title VI Indian Education afterschool programs and summer schools. Once Mickaela graduated High School she found passion in giving back to her community. As she attended Utah Valley University she was part of the Cultural Envoy Leadership Program. Her time in the Leadership Program taught her the power of being a leader and role model. She worked as the Program Coordinator as well as the Native American section leader. With those roles she was able to travel across the United States as well as Canada sharing her experiences as an Indigenous Women attending University. During her time at UVU she worked with both Nebo and Alpine School Districts. She continues to volunteer her time teaching Native Pow Wow dances for K-12 students. Mickaela was able to graduate from Utah Valley University majoring in Sociology. She now works with the City of South Salt Lake as a Career Pathways Facilitator. She runs an afterschool program with PROMISE SSLC at the Best Buy Teen Tech Center. Mickaela is a self-made Small Indigenous Business owner. She owns and operates "Keikis Collection" where she makes custom beadwork for pets. Her work has been highlighted by Adobe and was sponsored by Adobe Co-Create in the Summer of 2022. She continues to create one of a kind pieces for pets all across the world alongside her four fur babies (Ashkii, Nalu, AJ, Afi). She pays tribute to her time as a Title VI Indian Education student where she learned the importance and power of her identity and culture.
